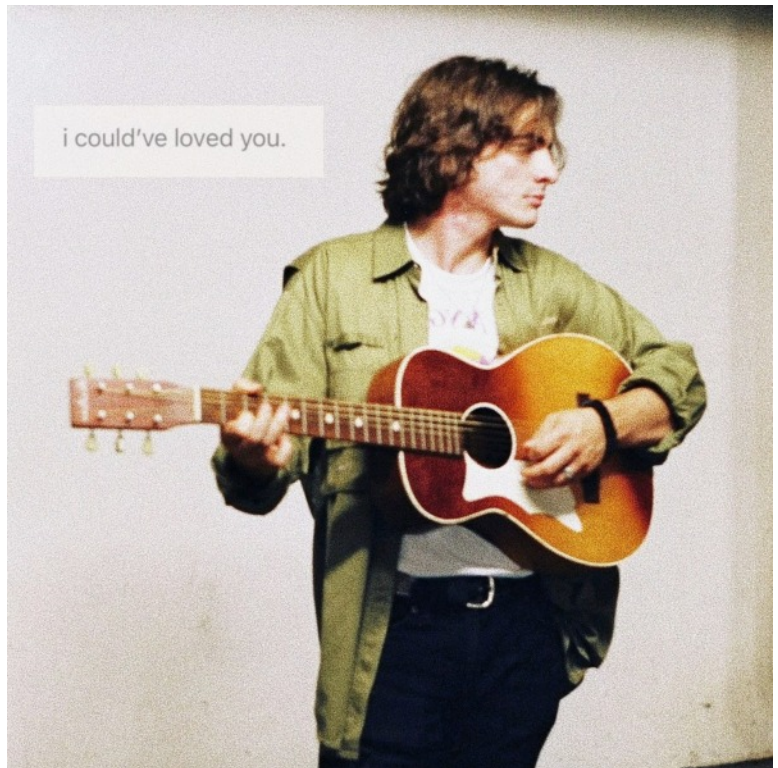

## New song release from Jackson Gillies, and more

Dec. 4, 2020—Since coming home from the Institute of Contemporary Music Performance in London, Jackson has been busy writing new songs and producing songs for clients. Some upcoming highlights:



Dec. 11 — The new song, “I Could’ve Loved You,” debuts on all streaming services. It’s co-produced by Jackson and Philip Etherington. Philip, well known as the producer of Lizzie McAlpine, Khai Dreams, and others, brought his tasteful production style to the tracking working with Jackson remotely due to the pandemic.

Dec. 12 — The 34th annual Unity Shoppe Telethon, hosted by Kenny Loggins. Jackson will sing “Change the World” with Kenny, a tribute to Unity Shoppe founder Barbara Tellefson, who recently passed on. Jackson will also sing “Celebrate Me Home” with Kenny and the Teen Choir. This virtual event will be streamed live on KEYT NewsChannel 3 from 4:30-8:30 p.m. This year’s Telethon will honor Santa Barbara’s essential workers.

Dec. 18 — “Jackson Gillies in Concert” at the Marjorie Luke Theatre, Santa Barbara. This free virtual concert, part of a series produced by Rod Lathim, will stream indefinitely, 24/7 at <https://luketheatre.org/>. Jackson will be accompanied by Randy Tico on bass, Trevor Hurvitz on guitar and keys, Brian Mann on keys, and Laura Mihalka on cello.

Dec. 20 — The Grace Fisher Foundation Winter Music Showcase at the iconic Granada Theatre will feature a piece Grace wrote for chamber orchestra, and will include performances by Jackson, Will Breman, Teen Star USA finalists, and the 3 for Joy Band.
